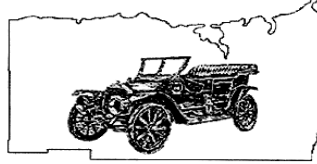

There might be problems if treated rusty metal is subjected to a lot of continuing moisture.

If your vehicle is coming out of storage, here are two things I learned the hard way. Weak batteries can take a charge and start a car, but the slightly lower voltage can melt wires and fuse boxes (less volts means more amps). You already know that brake fluid absorbs moisture over time and rusts brake lines, cylinders etc. So, keep that in mind before that first trip out of the barn becomes more thrilling than you intended.
